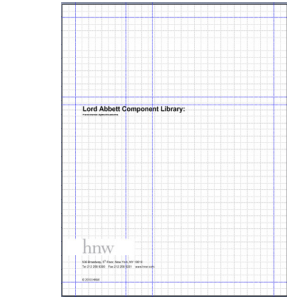

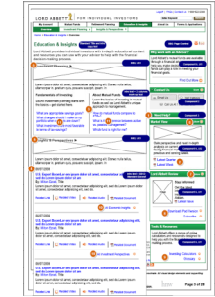
How to Use This Document

This document should be used in conjunction with the page level annotated wire frames, and the design style guide, as illustrated below:



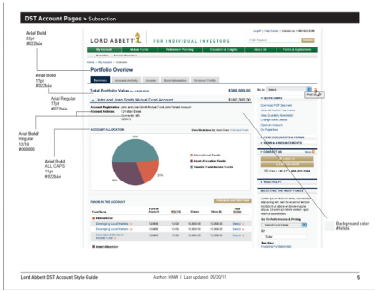
Component Library:
Functional Specifications

Provides the interaction notes and functional rules for each individual component on the site. Also provides all the layouts that can be used on the site, numbered and associated with specific pages.



Annotated wire frames

References the components, and any page-level rules that apply to that component ONLY on the page represented. Includes a site map and layout reference, as well as all Google Analytics.



Design style Guide

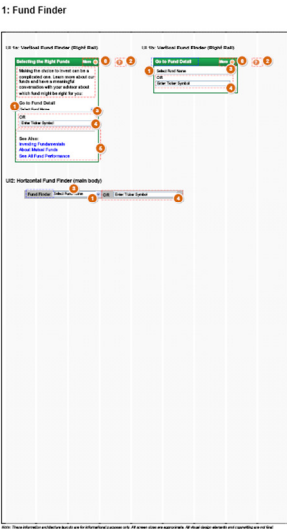
Should be used when designing all components and pages – provides the specifications around the styles, colors, fonts and images/iconography to use on that specific page or component.

Using this document

This document includes layout (template) and component-specific rules. The layouts are contained in the first chapter, and should be used to determine what the overall structure of the page is (though the actual templates are determined based on the components placed in them, so they only exist at the page level). The document also includes several “levels” of components, including:

- Global Components: Those which are accessed on almost every single page
- Building Block components: Those components used to build other components
- Standard Components: Components that are referenced throughout the site, and (in the case of page studio enabled components) can be configured based on a set of parameters defined in this document
- Unique components: Section-by-section listing of components that are unique within a specific section/page

Relative to components, this document includes two types of information at the component level:



Interaction Notes

Each component has interaction notes documented. Interaction notes include:

- Interactions within the component (hover states, expandables, sortables, etc.)
- Link destinations (if fixed at the general component level)
- Parent or sibling component references
- Display rules (used in conjunction with the design guidelines)
- Optional elements
- UI variations
- Mins and maxes for content elements within components

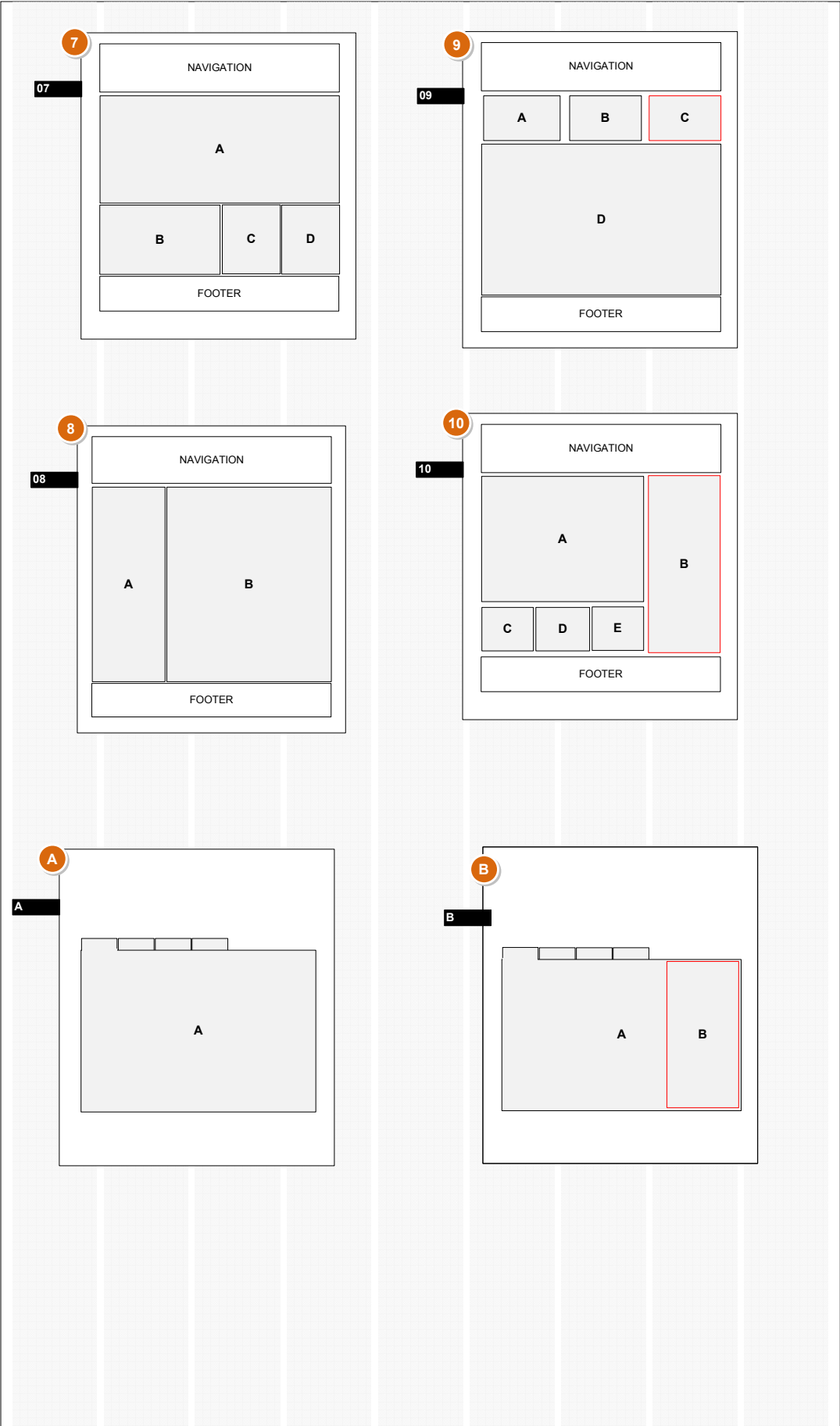

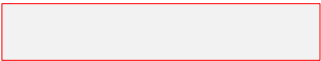

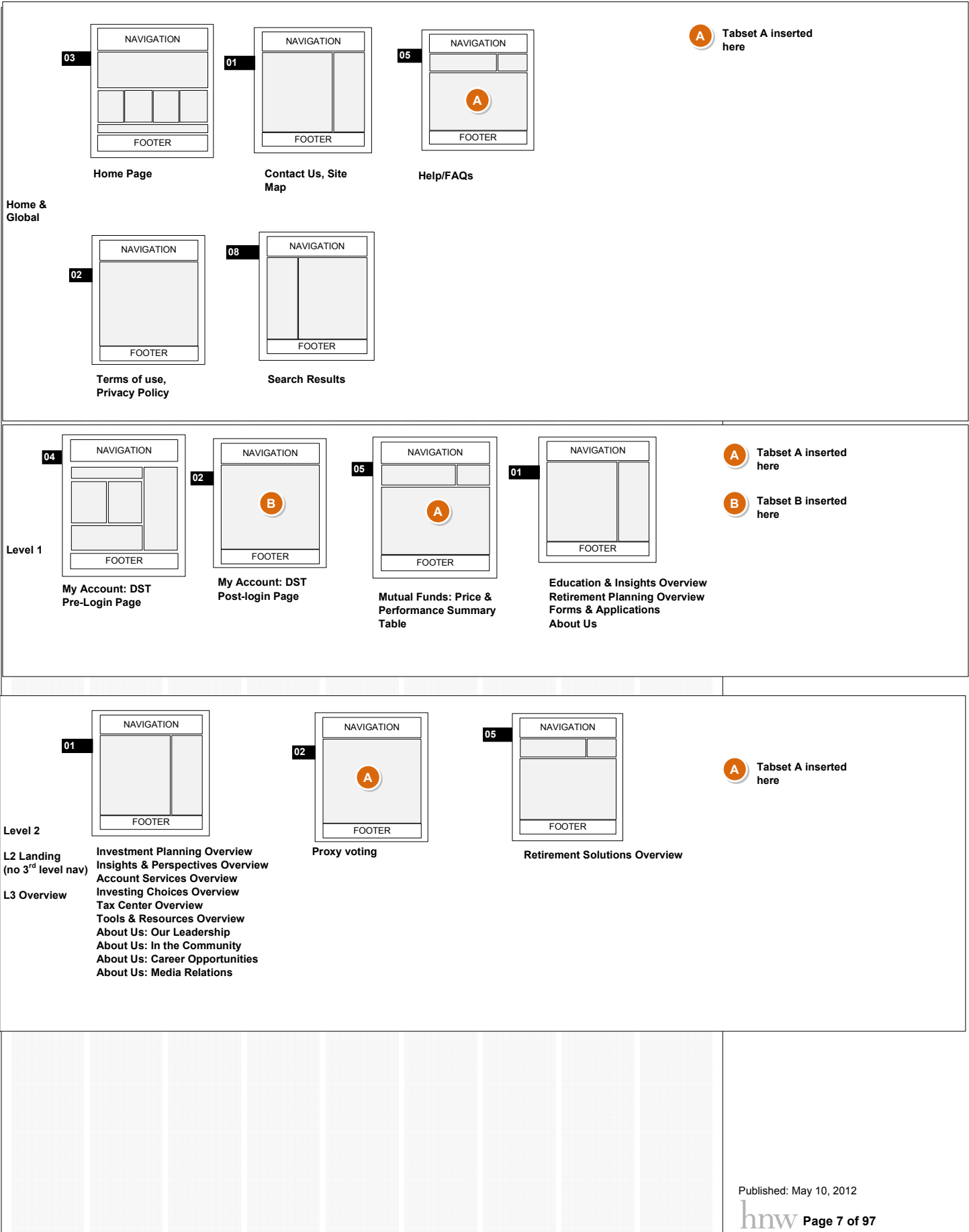

User can click on the bar or on the header to expand the tabset.

Only one menu can be open at a given time – and the first one defaults to being open, unless otherwise specified at the page level, or because someone has linked from a specific page.
- 8 There can be up to 12 links beneath an expandable header. They behave as standard links on hover, but turn black when selected. Selecting a link changes the content that appears to the right.
- 9 Vertical tabsets can also have headers that appear above the tabset and the associated body block.

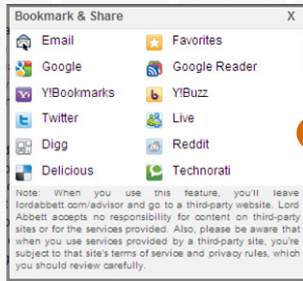

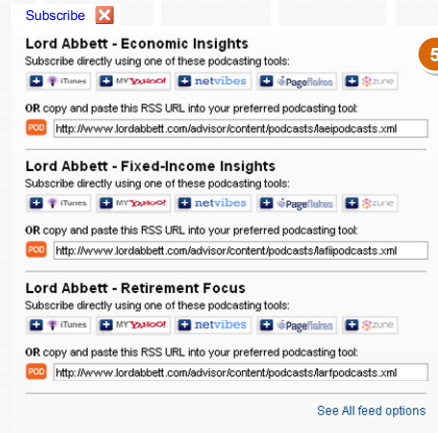

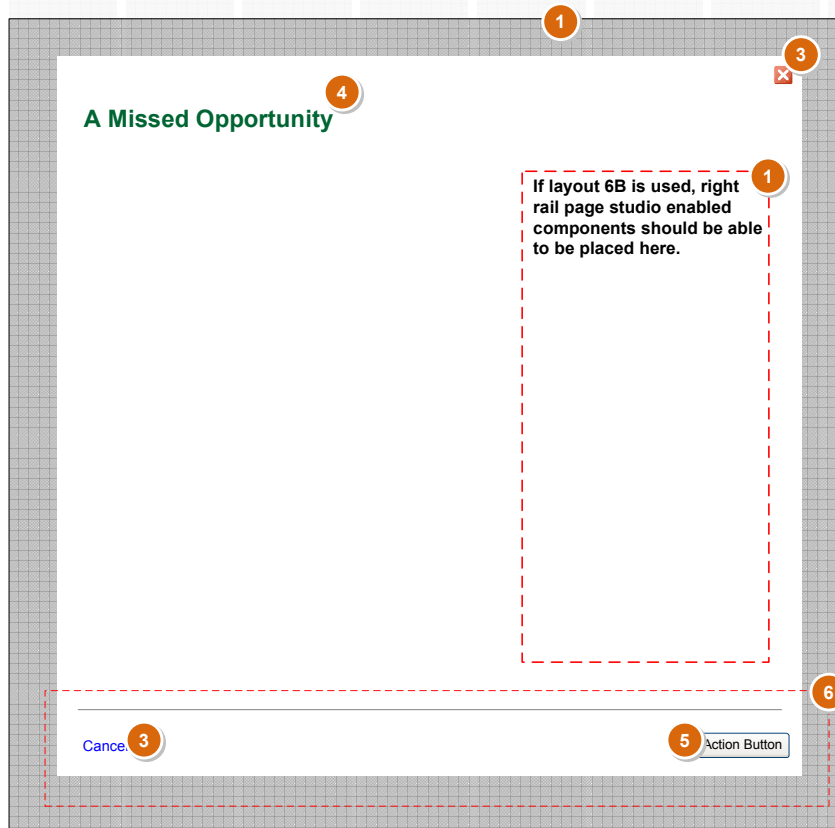

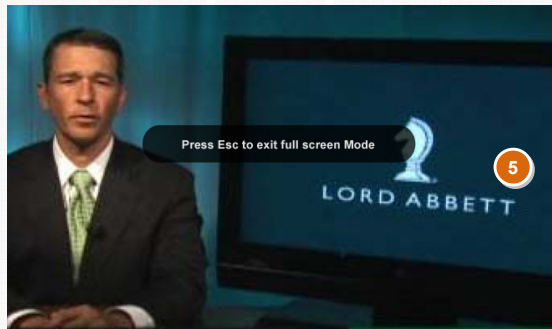

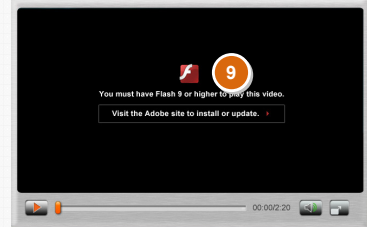

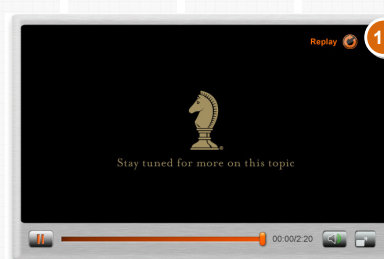

- When a user hovers over the video player, it should glow orange (as shown) both behind the still and turn the arrow orange.
- The loading status is shown as a rotating circle and may or may not be accompanied with a promotional message..
- If the user doesn't have Flash installed or the installed Flash is not a compatible version then an image with a link should appear to download the latest version of Flash. This link should underline on hover and should take the user to the Flash download page on Adobe's site <http://get.adobe.com/flashplayer>.
- The end state can have between 0-2 related videos. The related videos (unlike the featured videos on the video landing page) are related to the video that just played, and need to be associated with the selected video in the CMS. All elements of the related videos will be available and editable in the CMS (still image, date, title, teaser and duration). Clicking on one of these units (whole unit should be clickable) will load and begin playing that video in the player. This data needs to be added to the xml feed to be retrieved by the Flash video player.
- Clicking on the replay word or the icon should re-load the current video in the player.

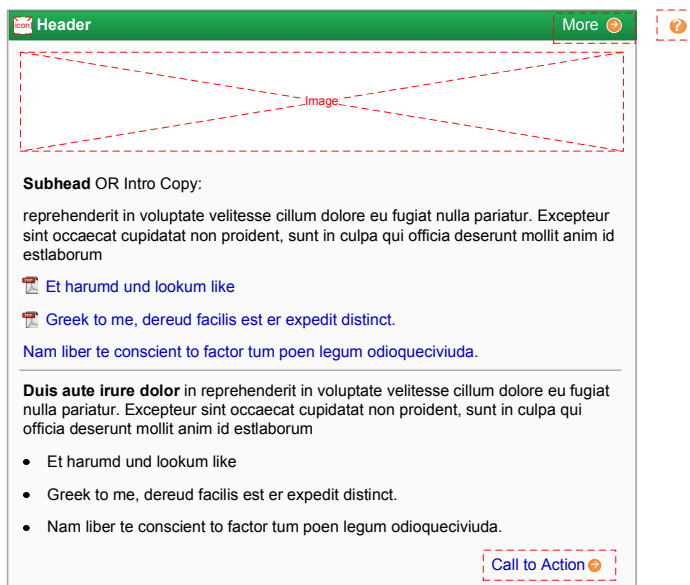
